## **Tim Mackey**

Tim Mackey had extensive experience at very high levels in the Australian Government before commencing as a strategic consultant and advisor to industry and government. Tim was a member of the Australian Government's Senior Executive Service right through the period from the first Hawke Government until the current Labor Government. For the 12 years until 2009, Tim was a Deputy Secretary in a range of Departments, including Primary Industries and Energy; Industry, Tourism and Resources; and Innovation, Industry, Science and Research. He provided Ministers with high level advice on policy development and formulation as well as efficient and effective program management and project implementation. Tim has a proven record of success in Executive Leadership, including management of large budgets and teams of staff. In his most recent position, he directly led a team of over 1000 staff, delivering around \$2b per annum in program funds and managing over \$150m per annum in departmental expenses. He has also been a member of the Boards of NATA the Australian Wheat Board and the Australian Horticultural Corporation.
